

# **Introduction / Background**

#### The SFTAS Programme for Results

The Federal Government of Nigeria has agreed with the World Bank on a multi-year (2018-2022) program to support Nigerian States to strengthen fiscal performance and sustainability: The State Fiscal Transparency, Accountability and Sustainability (SFTAS) Program for Results ("The Program").

#### **Background of this Project**

The Program development objective is to strengthen the fiscal transparency, accountability and sustainability in all 36 States, including in the context of COVID-19. The Program is to finance activities under two components:

- (i) a Program for Results (PforR) component in the amount of US\$700 million initially; and
- (ii) a technical assistance (TA) component, using the Investment Project Financing (IPF) instrument in the amount of US\$50 million.

The Program was enhanced in 2020 to include additional financing of US\$750 million approved in December 2020 for the PforR component as well as additional expected results

#### **Objective of this Project**

The overall objective of the engagement is to conduct 2020 and 2021 annual performance assessments (APAs) and to assess the performance of states against the 2021 EC and against the DLRs of the 4 new DLIs. Compliance with the annual EC and achievement of the 2020 and 2021 DLRs will be verified by the IVA and PwC through the 2020 and 2021 APAs covering the DLRs of the 9 original DLIs.

PwC is expected to carry out the assignment jointly with the Office of the Auditor General for the Federation (OAuGF), in its role as the Independent Verification Agent (IVA) for the Program.









# **Report Highlights**

- A total of two APAs have been conducted; 2018 and 2019 APAs. The number of States that were eligible for verification and disbursement in the 2 APAs are as follows: 2018 APA (24 States), 2019 APA (32 States).
- The DLR performance across all States showed continuous improvement in each APA. The 2019 APA recorded a much more improved performance as compared to the 2018 APA.
- A total of USD 360.2 million dollars has been disbursed to all participating States for the two years assessed.
- The number of DLRs assessed increased slightly over the assessment years, with 14 in 2018 and 15 in 2019.
- 12 states did not perform in the 2018 APA while 4 states did not perform in the 2019 APA.


# **Purpose of the Report**

The comparative report includes a comparison of the results achieved by all 36 States highlighting the results achieved in the 2018 and 2019 APAs, the conclusions reached on each of the tests/checks and DLRs recorded within the APA reports, any areas of focus and risk for the 2020 APA and in particular any potential gaps in the consistency of assessments.

#### **PwC will conduct the following:**

- Review all data previously collected for the assessments conducted in 2018 and 2019 for accuracy.
- Collect and review all state performance results to carry out a comparison for 2018 and 2019
- Submit the draft and final comparative report to the Program Coordination Unit (PCU) and the World Bank Group (WBG).












### General areas of focus

It is important for the team to minimize and avoid reporting errors by paying attention to detail and crosschecking data alongside final results to avoid inconsistencies and discrepancies.

The team should be able to query the plausibility of the findings and results given. In situations where figures or data changed drastically between 2019 and the next consecutive years, then, the team should be curious to know the reasons and come to a suitable conclusion.

The team should ensure consistency in the manner of review and reporting of the assessment in line with the verification protocols.

More specific risks and issues have been identified across all the DLIs assessed
